## Spelling Activity for Tuesday:

1. If you have your agenda at home, I would like you to find today's date. It is Tuesday April 14, 2020. When you have found the correct page, write your spelling words in your agenda (just like we do each week). This is good practice. As well, under today's date, make note of the weather and temperature...just like we do at school at the front of the classroom. I'm good if you use pictures or words. Let's try and do this each day.
2. Today select one of the possible spelling activities below and complete the task.

## Weekly Spelling Challenge:

1. Dear Teacher: Write a letter to your teacher using your spelling words. Be sure to use spaces in between your words AND underline your spelling words.
2. Rainbow Words: Write each spelling word with a pencil. Then, using different colours, trace the word.

3. Apple Words: Draw an apple for each of your spelling words. Write one spelling word inside each apple. Then colour your apples.
4. Add It Up: Add the letters in each of your spelling words to find the total. Use the numbers below:
(Consonants = 5) and (vowels = 1)
Example: Whale
Whale $=5+5+1+5+1=17$

## Weekly Spelling Challenge Continued:

5. Opposite Hand: Write your spelling words with your opposite hand, the one you usually don't write with.
6. Practice Test: Ask an adult at home to quiz you on your spelling words. If you misspell a word, write it correctly three more times.
7. Alphabetical Order: Write all your words in alphabetical order.
8. Vowel and Consonants: Write the consonants in blue and the vowels in red for each word.

## Reading:

The reading goal for grade 2 students is to read for a minimum of 15 minutes a day. This could be reading together or your child could read independently!

## Tuesday's Reading Task:

Read your favourite story book together with your child. Talk About:

- What was the most exciting part?
- What surprised them? Why?
- If they could be friends with any character in the story, who would it be and why?
