




Hi Grade 2 Families!

Dance Mat Typing




<u>Spelling Choice Activities:</u> Pick <u>two</u> activities to complete at home today.

- 1. Batter Up! Write a spelling word on your paper. Then, practice swinging your invisible bat for every letter in the word hit a home run and call out the word. Repeat for all of your words.
- 2. How Long Is It? Count the numbers of letters in each spelling word. Then write your words in order from the least numbers to the greatest (by, lit, ride, night...)
- 3. Alphabetical (ABC) Order: Write you spelling words in ABC order.
- 4. Story Time: Write a spooky story using your spelling words. Be sure to include interesting details and <u>underline</u> your spelling words in the story.
- 5. Colourful Words: Write each spelling word with a pencil. Then, use the <u>purple</u> for consonants and <u>orange</u> for vowels.
- 6. Add It Up: Add the letters in each of your spelling words to find the total. Consonants = 6 and vowels = 2. Example: friend - 6+6+2+2+6+6 = 28
- 7. Typed List: Use a computer to type your spelling words. Feel free to use different fonts, sizes or colours for each word How fun!
- 8. Practice Test: Ask an adult at home to quiz you on your spelling words. If you misspell a word, write it correctly THREE more times.
- 9. Telephone: Use the numbers on the telephone keypad to add the letters in each of your spelling words. Example: talk 7+2+5+5 = 19

<u>Math:</u> Division – Today you will be dividing objects into equal groups. Below it asks you to write a division sentence.

- 1. First you will count all the objects. Let's look at #1. How many bees are there altogether?
- 2. Then it asks for a number or equal groups. How many equal groups can you make? You might need to try a few different numbers. For example, could there be 4, 3 or 2 equal groups created?
- 3. Then you need to determine how many bees are in each equal group.
- 4. If you are having difficulties, you might want to re-watch yesterday's Youtube video to remind you how to divide.

- What adaptations does your animal have that help it survive?


You can also write down the answers to these questions, and share them with a family member later. Make sure to include a picture of your animal.
