
Math, Math, Math....

<u>Learning Goal</u>: This week we will be learning about fractions. Take a look at the fraction charts below.

Who loves to eat pizza? I do! Well, when we are looking at the fraction charts, look at the different circles below. They remind me of pizzas. You can see that each circle is split into equal pieces. But all the circles or pizzas are split into different equal parts or pieces. There is a circle with 2 parts. This is called half. The next circle is equally divided into 3 equal parts. The fourth is divided into 4 equal parts. The fifth is divided into 5 equal parts. The sixth is divided into 6 equal parts. The seventh is divided into 7 equal parts and can you take a guess how many equal parts are divided into eighths? You are right, there are 8 equal parts in the whole circle.



Now, watch the video <u>The Life Cycle of a Butterfly</u>. Once you have watched the video, fill out the last column of your chart with your new learning.


Alternatively, look at the image below, and read the short description to complete the chart.

SCIENCE Continued.

Butterflies start life as tiny eggs laid on top of leaves. The butterfly lays them on leaves they like to eat. When the egg hatches, out comes the larva, or caterpillar. They eat and eat. As they grow, they shed their skin or exoskeleton. When the caterpillar has grown to its full size, it cocoons as a chrysalis. This is called the pupa stage. When the caterpillar is done forming inside the pupa, a butterfly will emerge. At first its wings are folded, but within hours they pump blood into them and are ready to fly.


