





CAPTAIN'S SQUARE PUZZLE 2

Science Task

Let's play the Animal Adaptation Game

This year, we have learned a lot about animal adaptations (special features). Earlier in the year, we looked at and classified different types of animals. Do you remember what they were? (Mammals, birds, fish, reptiles, amphibians). Using your knowledge of animal adaptations and different types of animals, play the Animal Adaptation Game.

You can play this game with a family member, or on your own. Grab a few items around the house that you can use as pretend food (balls, small toys, blocks). The rules are simple. You just need to have a great imagination, which I know you all have. Just follow the instructions below:

- You are a black bear. What type of animal are you? You are hibernating for the winter. You will need to gather some food and hide them in a corner of your house for the winter. On your way you need to walk like a bear.
- You are an Indian rhinoceros. What type of animal are you? You need special protection from the sun and also from insects that might like to bite you. Roll around on the ground to get (pretend) mud all over you for sun protection.
- You are a caterpillar. What type of animals are you? Crawl like a caterpillar from one side of the room to the other, and then curl up into a cocoon before you emerge like a butterfly and fly around the room.
- You are a Canada goose. What type of animal do you belong to? You adapt to the seasons by flying from Ontario down South where it is warm to escape the cold winter weather. Now flap your wings, fly and honk like a Canada goose from one end of the room to the other. Now it is the end of winter and the weather is warming up back home in Ontario. Migrate back North for the summer. Flap your wings and honk all the way back home.
